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# Spotlight on young Christian Country artists

# **HEAVEN BOUND**

The Hackett Family from Eastern Kentucky is known as Heaven Bound. The family group includes four siblings - Cheyenne, who is twelve, Steven is eleven, Morgan is ten, and Charlotte is nine years old. The siblings have the love and support from their family and close friends who have shaped their lives in many ways.



heir dad Todd Hackett is their sound tech and provides vocals. Their mother Jamielee Hackett sings lead and plays the mandolin. Close family friend, Landon Mullins provides vocals and plays rhythm guitar and Steven plays guitar, ukulele and mandolin with his family and sisters. Steven says, "I am very thankful God gave me the talent to play the guitar." The kids take turns sharing the lead vocals on different songs. Jamielee mentions, "When we are booked, the children will do most of the singing. Occasionally depending on the event, the adults will also sing."

Mom, Jamielee recalls, "I was raised in Eastern Kentucky, going to church with my parents. Both of my parents were illiterate. Yet the Lord gave them the ability to understand the bible. My father was given the talent to play the guitar. I grew up on Hank Williams' Gospel music. I Saw The Lght was my father's favorite song and mine as well."

Todd's mother, Sandra Hackett and sisters sang Gospel in multi-states as the Short Sisters. Grandma Hackett has been a big inspiration to Heaven Bound. Grandma shares her pride for her grandchildren. "I am very proud of my grandchildren, especially for the work they do for the Lord." Their dad Todd adds, "I enjoy watching our group sharing the Gospel through testimonies in song."

Jamielee shares their story. "We decided to foster children in 2020 due to our youngest child Cheyenne who was seven years old at the time was being raised as an only child. All

2020, three little children stepped on our porch, wanting to call us mom and dad from the very beginning. We became family from that moment in our hearts. Steven was six, Morgan was five and Charlotte was four. We started teaching the children how to depend on Jesus and to let Him help them with the abuse they had suffered. After a couple of years fostering and hoping to adopt and keeping them grounded in Christ, our three younger ones gave their lives to Christ and were saved and baptized in the Fall of 2022. Cheyanne was saved and baptized in the Fall of 2019."

The Hacketts raised their growing family on a love for church and the old Bluegrass Gospel songs. It was at a little church where God would direct their path to singing. Mom remembers, "In Spring of 2023, Cheyenne kept asking an elderly man named Aulta Frazier to sing Old Blind Bartimaeus, at our church. One Sunday, he agreed to sing it only if she would help him sing it and she agreed. The following week the same thing happened except all four children sang with him. So, I tell everyone now that 'Old Bartimaeus' is what got Heaven Bound started."

Heaven Bound member, Landon Mullins who played guitar for Aulta Frazier, asked them to bring the children to a practice and let them learn some of the backup vocals to his old Bluegrass Gospel. She mentions, "We agreed, and the children sounded amazing singing backup vocals."

In April 2023, Landon asked them to come to Baker's Chapel for Songfest. It's a little country church in the hills of her siblings had moved out on their own. On March 13th, Kentucky with a great spirit. The children sang backup on a

few Bluegrass Gospel songs. Jamielee admits, "Everyone loved it and many were blessed at their boldness as they sang about Jesus. The Songfest at Baker's Chapel allowed us to get several appointments to other churches and sing.

She continues, "In December 2023, Aulta Frazier decided he was not able to sing due to health issues. Landon Mullins urged us to keep singing and he came up with the name Heaven Bound. I knew instantly this is what our group name should be called."

Landon proudly states, "Out of all the groups I have played and sang with I get the biggest blessing playing with these children."

Heaven Bound recorded their first CD in February 2024 and debuted the CD in April at the East Kentucky Gospel Fest. Those kids captured the hearts of all the attendees and received a blessing from God with their anointed singing. When they sing and minister at churches, their most requested song is *Easter Hallelujah* which Cheyenne, Morgan and Charlotte. sing accapella.

Cheyenne shares her favorite song to sing. "Your Cries Have Awoken The Master is my favorite song because I believe Jesus always hears me." Middle sister, Morgan says, "I enjoy singing and pray God gives me more talent. Charlotte who is the youngest says, "I love singing and enjoy learning new songs."

The siblings have participated in their school talent shows and have won the last two years. Their mom mentions, "The most important thing about the talent show is not because they won, it's that it inspired other children to sing Gospel music. In 2023, our children were the only ones that sang a Gospel song in the talent show. In 2024, many other children choose to sing Gospel as well."

Last year was a busy year for Heaven Bound. They sang at 194 appointments including traveling to Missouri to do a live Gospel radio show. They made the front page of the Big Sandy News, a local newspaper, twice. But December was the most

important time they were front page news because it was the most important day of their lives. Jamielee gleams with joy, "Finally, on December 2nd, after 1849 days in foster care, we became an official family when Stephen, Morgan and Charlotte's adoption became final!"

"Our goal for 2025 is to visit as many churches as possible to share the Gospel of Jesus in song. We pray many will receive a blessing and many souls will come to be saved as we minister in songs. We also pray the children's testimonies how Jesus rescued them from abuse and changed their lives will inspire other children to pick up His Cross and carry it to all nations."

Along with the guidance of their family, they have been inspired and encouraged by several Gospel music artists. The family shares, "Rick Moore and Spiritual Echoes, which we met at Baker's Chapel at Song Fest; we bought their CD and we learned every song on it in very little time and purchased tracks to them so we could take the lead on some of the songs. Living Water continues to encourage and inspire us along with James Adams with Pardoned By Grace. James always helped Steven with guitar and learning new chords. Also, Mike and Tina Hazelbaker of Called inspired the girls to keep on singing. All these groups have helped us tremendously in the last two years."

Cheyenne, Steven and Morgan are on the school's academic team. Cheyenne and Charlotte play basketball and Cheyenne, Charlotte and Morgan cheer at their school. All of them keep an honor average with Cheynne and Steven maintaining straight A's.

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

blank sheet of paper and a pen can become a wonderful work of art when a songwriter writes down lyrics to their songs. It can go from words on paper to a chart-topping hit song that can be heard for generations. More importantly, it can be a song that changes someone's life when they hear it that leaves an impact that will last a lifetime. Songwriter, Mike Owens shares his perspective on his song, *Ink Stains*.

"Ink Stains is a writer's song. I am only a writer. I do not perform nor sell products; so, my desire is to write a song that will really make a difference in someone's life. I pour my soul into every line and I'm always thinking of a better way to say what's been said a thousand times before. As a writer, I want the lyrics to leave the page and penetrate the heart of the listener; to touch the emotions and move them to action. As the song says, 'What good are these words stuck here on this page if they never find a soul in need of Your grace.' As a writer, I know I just hold the pen. I pray for God to send the words that will bring a soul to Him."

Considering who might be best to record the song, Mike shares, "When I finished writing *Ink Stains*, I began to think of someone who could most effectively deliver the message. David House was the obvious choice. I met David and his wife, Barbara, at ICGMA and heard him sing. I called him and he agreed to look over the lyrics. In a few days, he responded and told me he loved the song and wanted to

arrange it and record it. He developed the melody, put his smooth voice on it and it really came to life. David is a very humble man with a sweet spirit and that really makes the song special."

The writer mentions the lyrics in the first verse. "'They look real good on paper, these lyrics that I write. I wonder, do they make a difference, will they change a life? Will they help a weary soul find a little faith? And can they make this troubled world be a better place?' God says His Word will not return void but will accomplish His will. My prayer is that my songs make Him smile and draw people closer to Him."

utism is a complex neurodevelopmental disorder that affects millions of people worldwide. It is characterized by difficulties in social interaction, communication, and repetitive behaviors. Although autism is becoming more widely recognized, there is still a lack of understanding and awareness surrounding the disorder. As a result, many individuals and families affected by autism struggle to find the support and resources they need. We are spotlighting a music event and a podcast during Autism Awareness Month that offer support to those dealing with Autism.

### The Country Music Autism Awareness Foundation

harnesses the heart and soul of Country music to champion autism awareness, advocacy, and support. Through live performances, educational initiatives, and community-driven programs, we create meaningful connections that inspire understanding and inclusion. Their mission is to use the power of music to amplify voices, provide vital resources, and build a compassionate, supportive community for individuals on turning awareness into action - one song at a time.

The Country Music Autism Awareness Foundation was founded in 2024 by Christian Country singer-songwriter Doug Mathis. The 2024 inaugural event raised more than \$6,500 for Vanderbilt Kennedy Center's Treatment and Research Institute for Autism Spectrum Disorders (VKC TRIAD). It was sponsored by Gus Arrendale and Springer Mountain Farms and hosted by Devon O'Day. Performers included T. Graham Brown, John Berry, Wade Hayes, Jimmy Fortune, Doug Mathis, Dillon Massengale, Steve Anthony, and Darryl Worley.

"The performances were stellar, the crowd was incredible, and we were able to interact with and provide resources to many families with autistic loved ones," said Pablo Juárez, co-director of VKC TRIAD on 2024's inaugural event. "We can't thank Doug and Debbie enough for their generosity, coordination, and recognition of the importance of TRIAD's mentions, "Whether it's one individual's time, artistic efforts, work with families."

Due to increased demand, the Country Music Autism The Country Music Autism Awareness Foundation Awareness Foundation (CMAAF) relocated their 2nd Annual fundraising event, 'An Acoustic Evening For Autism' to Country music landmark Nashville Palace in Nashville, Tennessee. The event is set for April 1, and proceeds raised will benefit Vanderbilt Kennedy Center's Treatment and Research Institute for Autism Spectrum Disorders (VKC TRIAD) in Nashville.

"Given last year's successful launch, we moved our the autism spectrum and their families. # Why Not Me the World Podcast

Beginning in April, commemorating the start of Autism Acceptance Month. veteran Nashville based music producer and podcast host Tony Mantor will launch Humanity Over Handcuffs: The Silent Crisis, a special series on his chart topping Why Not Me the World podcast on autism. The series will feature exclusive indepth conversations with U.S. law makers, police officers, psychologists, judges, attorneys, and more.

During his recent address to the U.S. Congress, President Trump cited the rising prevalence of autism diagnoses which have risen from one in 10,000 children, to one in 36. More specifically, how Autistic people have been historically treated in the legal system will be Mantor's specific focus on the special series. Autism and the legal system is undoubtedly a relative topic and societal challenge that has been recently reported on by NPR, Salon, The Marshall Report and ABA Journal. Mantor's new series seeks to revitalize a conversation around the highly sensitive topic to bring about solutions.

"The series purpose is to refrain from assigning blame, and instead focus on developing solution driven strategies," Mantor said about the new podcast series. "I just think we need to do more to acknowledge and be empathetic enough to find solutions on how the justice system deals with autism or other mental health issues, versus just arresting them and treating them as criminals. Not only here in the United States, but worldwide."



The Humanity Over Handcuffs series will take a deep dive into stories and cases of autistic people's experience by both the law enforcement and legal system from thought leaders. Since launching in 2023, Mantor's Why Not Me The World podcast has been downloaded more than 900,000 times

across 85 countries and more than 1,500 cities worldwide. It has topped various mental health podcast charts worldwide including Spotify's Top 200 chart and Apple Podcast's Mental Health charts in the U.S., Great Britain and Canada. Leading podcast search engine Listen Notes consistently rates the podcast among the top 0.5% of podcasts worldwide.

Veteran Nashville music producer Tony Mantor wrote and recorded a song in 2021 titled, *Why Not Me*, as a tribute to individuals with Autism. Why Not Me The World podcast aims to bridge that gap by providing valuable information and insights into autism, fostering empathy and understanding, and promoting acceptance and inclusion, Nashville based Music Producer Tony Mantor explores the remarkable impact his guests make by empowering their voices in spreading awareness about autism and helping break down the barriers of understanding.

Join Mantor and his guests as they delve into the world of autism and explore topics such as diagnosis, treatment, research, and personal stories from those in the autistic community. Together, we can create a more informed and compassionate society for individuals with autism. 



If You Hadn't Been There is Dolly Parton's tribute to nearly 60 years of marriage to her late husband. Dolly released an emotional ballad honoring her late husband Carl Thomas Dean, who died on Monday, March 3rd at the age of 82.

Parton announced the release of the single on an Instagram post. "I fell in love with Carl Dean when I was 18 years old. We have spent 60 precious and meaningful years together," Parton said. "Like all great love stories, they never end. They live on in memory and song. He will always be the star of my life story, and I dedicate this song to him."

The ballad looks back on the love and support Parton received from Dean throughout their nearly six decades of marriage.

"If you hadn't been there / Where would I be? / Without your trust / Love and belief / The ups and downs / We've always shared / And I wouldn't be here / If you hadn't been there," Parton sings in the touching ballad.


"If you hadn't been there / Well, who would I be? / You always see the best in me / You're loving arms have cradled me / You held me close, and I believe," she adds to the second verse.

The release of this song follows an outpouring of love Dolly has received over the last month. She released a statement on Instagram to express her gratitude. "This is a love note to family, friends, and fans. Thank you for all the messages, cards, and flowers that you've sent to pay your respects for the loss of my beloved husband Carl," Parton said. "I can't reach out personally to each of you but just know it has meant the world to me. He is in God's arms now and I am okay with that. I will always love you"

"Carl and I spent many wonderful years together," Parton wrote. "Words can't do justice to the love we shared for over 60 years. Thank you for your prayers and sympathy."

Carl Dean was a private man who kept a low profile. In a 2020 interview with Entertainment Tonight, Dolly said her husband had never wanted to be in the spotlight. "It's just not who he is. He's like, a quiet, reserved person and he figured if he ever got out there in that, he'd never get a minute's peace and he's right about that."

Carl Thomas Dean was born on July 20, 1942, in Nashville to Virginia Bates Dean, known as Ginny, and Edgar Henry Dean, according to Dolly Parton's 1994 autobiography, "Dolly: My



Life and Other Unfinished Business." He lived in East Ridge, Tennessee, as a child. He pursued a quiet life owning an asphalt-paving business.

The couple met outside the WishyWashy Laundromat the day she moved to Nashville in 1964, when Dolly was 18 and Carl Dean was 21. Dolly and Carl got married on Memorial Day in 1966 in Ringgold, Georgia, and they renewed their vows 50 years later in 2016. The couple lived on a farm outside Nashville for decades.

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

# Moe Bandy Releases Album, 'Songs I Missed'






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# LISA DAGGS


rowing up in California Lisa was raised around a musical family. "My brother, Larry had a beautiful voice and an all-boy band, called the Intruders while I was growing up. He was ten years older than me, so I thought that was the coolest thing ever. My dad also had a very beautiful voice. I never tired of him singing Fly Me to The Moon in the arrangement of Tony Bennett. I began singing in church. I was blessed to have a big speaker and a microphone at home, and I rehearsed along with Linda Ronstadt's records. I loved her songs, and her range was the same as mine, so it exercised my vocal cords perfectly. (I'm an alto)"

Lisa's influences range from Bonnie Raitt, Wynonna, Faith Hill and of course as she stated, Linda Ronstadt and the great Motown singer, Gladys Knight. She remarks, "I know that's a vast spread of genres, but if you listen to my voice and the library of songs, you'll hear what I mean. I'm a little bit Country, Soul and Blues. You can listen to all my music on any of the streaming stations. Just remember, if you would, CD's have a much higher quality of sound than the streaming stations do. (Just a reminder, you help the artist out when you buy direct)."

Lisa launched her career by moving to Nashville in pursuit of her dream. She worked as a studio vocalist and sang in numerous showcases for local Nashville songwriters. Lisa later left the Nashville scene to connect with new audiences on the West Coast.

After struggling through the challenges and temptations of an entertainer's lifestyle, Lisa worked to rediscover the inner peace she had lost. "I was full of self-will, running my own show, and believing I knew what was best for my life," she recalls. She struggled through the process of overcoming the severe consequences caused by her previous lifestyle. In a career that spans over three decades, Lisa has experienced many memorable moments. "Both of my parents were in the room! They had already announced 'Female Vocalist' in which I was also nominated, and I thought all chances were gone. There were only male soloists and boy bands up for the biggest award of the night. Then they called my name! What an honor!! And all in front of my mom and dad."

Lisa was invited to travel with Bill & Gloria Gaither and the Homecoming Friends for several years. Many of their videos have hit gold status on the Billboard charts. She has 35 number one radio singles. The very first number one was Be Like Noah and it charted on the CCM Magazine's Country chart. More hit singles include Hands On the Plow, You Are My Ministry, Forgiveness is a Powerful Thing, Well Worn,

Regardless, The Light and You Are Enough, which gained 64K views in two weeks on the YouTube video.

She was awarded 'Country Artist of the Year' presented by The Diamond Awards in Nashville, Tennessee. The most prestigious award was 'Entertainer of the Year' from the Inspirational Country Music Association (ICMA) on the Grand Ole' Opry Stage in Nashville. After that night, Lisa received a book deal through Salem Communications, entitled "No Turning Back, Regardless."

Lisa's current single is *Dear John*, which she co-wrote with her husband, Ronnie Horton and Gerald Crabb from the brand new CD project, "You Are Enough." Lisa shares details on the single: "John the Baptist is a prominent force listed in the bible and this song describes his character, (rugged and odd), his relationship with Jesus, and his ultimate sacrifice of being beheaded. This song has a little throwback to the great Dusty Springfield, also one of my favorites. I was born on the West Coast and my parents loved music and often played Dusty Springfield, John Gary, Andy Williams and Tony Bennett. Most people reading this, unfortunately, won't remember these incredible artists."

The California native shares how God spared her life on numerous occasions. "There are so many stories I could share with you. I was supposed to be born a blue baby. 



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

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## A Love Story That Began with a Burger King Date

Born and raised in the Bible Belt of East Tennessee, both Kenny and Maryann grew up with Sunday church services and strong Christian values. However, life led them down different paths before fate brought them together in 1993.

At the time, Maryann was a young single mother to her baby boy, Tyler. She had married at just 17 years old, hoping to build a stable family, but soon found herself trapped in a dangerous world of drugs and crime due to her husband's lifestyle. Fearing for her safety and that of her son, she made the courageous decision to walk away and start over.

Kenny laughs as he recalls their first date, saying, "Yep, Burger King and she had to pay! But looking back, that night was the start of something incredible. I wasn't just falling in love with Maryann; I was also stepping into a life I never expected, one that would change me forever."

# Fame, Temptations, and a Life Spiraling Out of Control

Just three months after their wedding, Kenny's music career took off. A booking agency from Orlando, Florida, discovered his talent, launching him into a whirlwind of concerts and tours. Performing at venues like Walt Disney World and Nashville's WildHorse Saloon, he found himself sharing stages with 90s Country music legends like Kenny Chesney, Charlie Daniels, and Sara Evans. It was a dream deep conviction settled in Kenny's heart - he realized he had come true but beneath the surface, things were spiraling out of control.

The fast-paced life of a musician brought temptations that Kenny couldn't resist. Alcohol, drugs, and infidelity became part of his reality, while Maryann was at home, raising their


growing family. By 1997, they had welcomed another son, Tanner Lane, and Maryann was shouldering the responsibility of motherhood alone. Meanwhile, Kenny was losing himself to a destructive lifestyle, blinded by the thrill of fame.

### A Moment of Confession and an Act of Grace

Then, in January 1998, everything changed. One night, a never truly been born again. Overcome with guilt, he confessed everything to Maryann. He admitted to his infidelity, his addictions, and the darkness that had consumed him. It was a heartbreaking moment, but instead of turning away, Maryann did something extraordinary. Through her

# A Near-Death Experience and a Calling from God

Despite his newfound faith, Kenny continued touring, still holding onto his Country music career. But in August 1999, fate intervened once again. While on tour, Kenny and his band were nearly killed in a head-on collision with a drunk driver. The crash, at 70 mph, left him with lifethreatening injuries, including a lacerated liver. Maryann, just 27 years old, flew across the country in the middle of the night to be by his side in a South Dakota hospital. She

never left his bedside, praying for his recovery and trusting that God had a plan.

Lying in that hospital bed, Kenny knew God had been calling him for years, and he had been running from it just like Jonah. That near-death experience became his moment of complete surrender. He finally accepted that his purpose was not in the Country music industry but in serving God through ministry.

### A New Life in Ministry

Since then, Kenny has dedicated his life to preaching and sharing his testimony through music. For the past 21 years, he has been a Christian country singer-songwriter and evangelist, traveling across the U.S. with 150-160 speaking and concert events every year. He has also performed for 25 seasons in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee, in an Oldies/Classic Country show, where he shares his powerful testimony with audiences.

Maryann is a teacher at Legacy Christian Academy in Kingston, Tennessee, and speaks at women's conferences and events across the country. Through her words, she inspires thousands, sharing her story of faith, forgiveness, and God's unshakable love.

### **Impacting Lives Across America**

Kenny is also an avid sportsman, serving on the National Pro Staff for Mossy Oak, Wildlife Research Center, and TenPoint Crossbows. He frequently speaks at Men's Ministry events and Sportsman's Banquets, using his passion for the outdoors to connect with people on a deeper level.

Through their journey, Kenny and Maryann have witnessed countless lives transformed. Marriages have been restored, addicts have been set free, and hearts have been turned toward Christ. Their mission remains clear: "to share God's grace and remind people that no one is too far gone for redemption".

Kenny's latest album, "People Like Us," is available on all streaming platforms, and his new single, *We Need Jesus*, is set to hit Christian radio soon. His concerts are more than just music; they are a celebration of faith, love, and second chances.

### Reflecting on their journey, Kenny says:

"The end goal at any event, whether a concert or speaking engagement, is to see lives changed by the amazing grace of our loving Father. We've seen marriages restored, addicts set free, and sinners saved and that's what keeps us going."

"We believe that saved people should have fun and celebrate the risen Savior! Expect to laugh, have fun, and rejoice at a Kenny Evans concert."



























# NASIMILE Super Pickers

For the greatest musicians in Nashville who play on sessions, record producer Rick Schweinsberg coined the title "The Nashville Super Pickers." This story features one of Nashville's finest.

Joe Cook Guitar

Born in Dallas, Texas, with a father involved in the Texas music scene playing guitar, Joe Cook was destined to be a musician. "My dad played in honky tonks and bars, but I loved watching him play at home. My parents divorced when I was four, and I moved with my mother to Texarkana, Arkansas. There was no YouTube back then, so I started playing guitar at ten years old through looking at a Mel Bay Guitar Chords book my dad had given me. When I started playing, my mom started praying I would not go to the bars like my dad," shares Joe.

He continues, "I went to high school with Bobby Bowen, vocalist and bass player for Midsouth. In June of 1984, a young pastor came to our little church and took a liking to me. He spent time with me, and witnessed to me a lot. He led me to the Lord and then baptized me in the cattle pond on our property in Arkansas. When Bobby heard I got saved, he called me to come and audition for the band in 1985. I started playing guitar for Midsouth in 1986 and stayed until 1993. The five of us traveled on a bus together. We had to take turns driving, and I didn't like it when it was my turn," he laughs.

Midsouth were somewhat pioneers in the field of Christian Country and just a little ahead of their time. After previously playing as Midsouth Quartet and changing to a new style, the Southern Gospel fans did not know at first what to think. They were somewhere between Alabama and Restless Heart, but with a message in the lyrics still very much Christian. However, the young people loved them. Their impact in Christian Country is still strong today, with parents playing Midsouth for their children and introducing them to their grandchildren at reunion concerts.

"There was no social media back then. Now it is really coming to light how much people loved us. It's great when people contact me about what an impact Midsouth had on them," Joe shares.

Originally signed with the Eddie Crook Company, John May of Word Records came calling. John had been tapped to start a new Christian Country division of Word called Canaan



Records. At that time, late '80s, early '90s, Country music was exploding as '90s Country became the hottest music around. With groups like Diamond Rio, Alabama, and Restless Heart singing clean lyrics, Christians began listening as well. Joe had moved to Nashville with Midsouth in 1989, and saw many of his friends playing for Country bands. "My friends were not driving the bus, and were making a lot more

money than me," he laughs. I felt like it may be time for me to leave the band and make the move to Country music."

Joe started touring with Billy Joe Royal for two years. Next, he toured with Terri Clark. Terri was asked to be the opener for the George Strait tour, and Joe was playing sold out arenas. He says something people do not know about Terri is she is a great guitar player, entertainer, and very genuine. She loved allowing Joe to just be Joe and add his energy to the concerts, jumping off amps and other things on stage, unlike when he did a Chuck Berry guitar hop across the stage of the National Quartet Convention and felt the judgement of the elderly in the crowd. He really enjoyed getting to play for Terri for ten years. He also made many connections while out with her on George Strait's tour.

Joe moved from Terri Clark to Dusty Drake, Chris Cagle their last song. Terri told them she didn't want to ride a horse,

and then to Joe Diffie. After that, he played for Alan Jackson, then Tanya Tucker for a short time. His list of tour credits is lengthy and impressive. He has toured with David Lee Murphy, Mark Chestnutt, Buddy Jewell, George Ducas, Ray Scott, Bellamy Brothers, T.G. Shepherd, and Doug Stone. Joe also does studio work, sometimes in his home to add guitar parts while he is off the road, and sometimes does studio sessions. He is not yet ready to come completely off the road and only do sessions.

All touring artists have funny road stories to share. Sometimes, a non-disclosure agreement (NDA) prevents them from sharing some, but there are always ones that forever stay in their memories. Here are a few of Joe's:

"In Midsouth, we were playing in Sheridan, Arkansas. Donny, Bobby and I loaded up in my VW Beetle. A little way

down the road, we had a flat tire. We needed to get to a gas station to fix the tire and started walking. A couple of guys stopped to pick us up as we walked. We didn't think too much about it, other than we wouldn't have to walk all the way. We all got in the backseat, and realized we were sitting on glass. The back window was busted out. We all looked at each other without saying anything, realizing these guys had stolen the car we were riding in. Then, I saw that one of them had a gun. We were so scared, we started shaking and talking about Jesus. Then we started praying. God protected us, because they took us to the gas station, got the tire inflated and took us back to my car," Joe shared.

Another time with Midsouth, the bus stopped at Shoney's. While standing at the salad bar, two long haired guys asked, "Who's on that bus?" Bobby jokingly responded, "Wrestlers." When the Midsouth guys got ready to pay their bill, they realized the two long-haired guys were waiting on them at the cash register. "That's when one guy cornered Bobby, and they began scuffling. I saw the other guy start to come up

behind Bobby to grab him, too, so I ran to help. The police had been called by an employee. The two guys took off as soon as they knew the police were coming. Fortunately, everyone saw what happened and the police believed our story. They wanted Bobby to go to the hospital to get checked out for the bite on his side from one of the guys. Bobby refused to go, and someone said, 'You need to go. This guy just ate at Shoney's breakfast bar, then bit you! You probably need a tetanus shot!' That week, we were on Nashville Now with Ralph Emery. Ralph had us retell that story on the show!" Joe laughed.

Joe's last story was about playing the Houston Astrodome with Terri Clark. "For this concert, it is tradition for the artist to ride on horseback and circle the arena waving after playing their last song. Terri told them she didn't want to ride a horse.

so they put her on the back of a convertible. As she waved, the band stayed on stage and continued to play her out. The fans were coming down and getting closer and closer to the car and her. They started trying to give her highfives as she went around. Suddenly, we saw her fall, much like the video of JFK's assassination. We could not hear with the loud music and didn't know if she had been shot. The convertible went flying out of the stadium with her in the floor. We threw down our instruments and took off after her. They took her to the hospital. We found out one of the fans had grabbed her hand instead of smacking it, and as the car was moving, they had pulled her arm out of socket. She was in so much pain," Joe offered. "It was scary!"

When asked what advice he would give a young guitarist who wanted to become a "Super Picker" in Nashville, Joe

responded, "In Nashville, connections are very important. Musicians get hired by word of mouth, not by auditions. If I could tell any young guitarists today what I would do to become a Nashville player, I would tell them to always realize your gift comes from above. It is going to come out, no matter what instrument you choose. Though God gives you the gift, it's up to you to improve it. Practice! Practice! Play with other musicians. Play with musicians who are better than you to make you better. If you do get an opportunity to play with someone, always keep your focus on God. Keep your unsolicited opinions to yourself. And when you get that opportunity, give it your all, because you never know who is watching. Knowing my gift comes from God, I know He has always opened doors for me and will, as long as I keep my focus on Him. Know that you are going to fail, but God will always be there to catch you. There will always be another gig."


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# JOHNNY PAYCHECK

Johnny PayCheck is considered by many within the Country music industry and arts to be one of the founders of the Outlaw Country music movement during the 70s. That said, his soulful sound and phrasing made him a legend amongst the honky-tonk crowd and his peers. Even to this day new fans are discovering the depth of his musical talent far exceeds his mega-hit *Take This Job And Shove It.* His musical career spanned over forty years and included a massive catalog of songs and performances.

Born Donald Eugene Lytle on May 31, 1938, in Greenfield, Ohio, PayCheck was playing in talent contests by the age of nine. Billing himself as 'The Ohio Kid,' he left home in his teens and played bar gigs and clubs around the country.

He later moved to Nashville where his considerable talents did not go unnoticed, and Music Row executive Buddy Killen signed PayCheck to a songwriting deal with Tree Publishing (now Sony/ATV Music Publishing) and landed him a Decca Records contract. Using the stage name Donny Young, the singer recorded four singles for the label that failed to make a dent on the charts. PayCheck went to work for some of the top bands in Country music, including those of Porter Wagoner, Ray Price, and Faron Young. From 1962 to 1966 PayCheck was the front man and bass player for George Jones' band, the Jones Boys. The singer re-invented himself as Johnny PayCheck,

A pair of singles, A-11 and Heartbreak Tennessee, on the tiny Hilltop label produced some chart activity during the course of the next three years. PayCheck enjoyed his first Top 10 single in 1966 with The Lovin' Machine and quickly followed up with Motel Time Again and Jukebox Charlie. In December 1966, Tammy Wynette placed her first single on Billboard's chart with her recording of PayCheck's song, Apartment #9. Sharing co-writing credits with Fuzzy Owen and Bobby Austin, the song was named the Academy of Country Music's 'Song of the Year.' Ray Price had a Top 5 record with PayCheck's Touch My Heart in 1966 as well.

Billy Sherrill signed PayCheck to a contract with Epic Records. By the end of 1971, PayCheck was back on the charts with *She's All I Got*, which peaked at No. 2. Paycheck followed up his success in the spring of 1972 with *Someone to Give My Love To*, which also reached the upper registers of the charts. For the next five years, Johnny maintained a presence on the record charts with varying degrees of success.

During the Outlaw movement of Waylon Jennings and Willie Nelson that took hold of Country music in 1976, PayCheck had a fairly good run on the charts. Beginning with



1977's Slide Off of Your Satin Sheets and I'm the Only Hell (My Mama Ever Raised), which both went Top10. In June 1977, Take This Job and Shove It entered the charts and provided PayCheck with his sole No. 1 song. Written by David Allan Coe, what was intended to be a song about a bad relationship, Take This Job was adopted as a battle cry for dissatisfaction in the workplace.

PayCheck lived a life that included many high points, but one that was also wrought with despairing depths. After he received some long overdue success based on the strength of his 1977 recording, *Take This Job and Shove It*, his stormy personal life - and subsequently his career - suffered. Problems with drugs, alcohol, and legal difficulties made it difficult for PayCheck to enjoy his good fortune.

PayCheck's personal life continued its downward spiral. Chronic financial woes and problems with the IRS forced him into bankruptcy a few years earlier. On a trip back to Ohio to visit family for the holidays, PayCheck had his final and most serious run-in with the law. He was sentenced to prison, and while going through the appeals process, PayCheck was signed by Mercury Records and scored a Top 20 single with *Old Violin*. After exhausting all of his appeals options, PayCheck was sent to the Chillicothe Correctional Institute. While incarcerated, PayCheck's old pal Haggard performed a show for the inmates, and the pair recorded an album that, to date, has not been released.

PayCheck served two years in prison and upon his 1991 release, emerged clean and sober. He also made good on the conditions of his parole. He kept his life on a straight course and gave anti-drug talks to young kids around the country as part of his required community service.

To his credit, and with an uphill battle ahead of him, PayCheck returned to the music industry and tried once again to resurrect his career. The singer resumed his touring career, which included appearances in Branson, Missouri, and he recorded for Playback Records. In 1996, the Country Music Foundation released a collection of PayCheck's early recordings for Little Darlin' that found favor with young fans of Classic Country music.

Present day, you won't find much said about Johnny PayCheck in the Country music history books or historical documentaries. You won't find a big exhibit honoring him in Nashville. You must look close to find where his mark was made on Country music. His brass placard still hangs backstage at the Opry. You can find autographed pictures still remaining at Tootsies and the Ernest Tubb Record Shop. You can find his 'Shove It' guitar at the Country Music Hall of Fame along with a few of his gold records. For the most part though, it is the fans who keep his music and memory alive while an industry still profits from the entertainer they would rather forget.

His peers would come from backstage and stand in silence just to hear him sing *Old Violin*. Today those same peers will tell you how they loved him and how he was an amazing vocalist and writer. It is an industry that has forgotten, not the fans or the musicians he worked alongside. Some leave him out of the pages of history due to his controversial missteps, others don't know his history even though his name reappears constantly alongside his peers that were more careful with their careers, but Johnny PayCheck is still a musical force to take notice of even today. As a matter of fact, his powerful and poignant song, *Old Violin*, from His "Modern Times" album, celebrates its 38th Anniversary since the release in March, 1987 by Mercury Records.

Despite *Old Violin* only peaking at #21 on Billboard's Hot Country Songs chart in 1987, along with being PayCheck's only self-written song on the album, the song is widely considered to be one of his signature songs, second only to *Take This Job And Shove It*. Other notable Country

artists who've recorded *Old Violin* include George Strait, Daryle Singletary, and Creed Fisher.


PayCheck received several accolades and awards during his career including Lifetime Achievement Award from BMI, six gold albums and numerous platinum albums. He was awarded the ACM Songwriter 1966 for *Apartment #9* and the ACM Career Achievement Award in 1977. This has only been presented three times in history. He won CMA 'Male Vocalist of the Year' and CMA 'Vocal Duo of the Year' w/Jody Miller in 1972, CMA 'Single of the Year' for *Take This Job and Shove It* in 1978, and CMA 'Album of the Year' for "Armed and Crazy - Epic." He received Grammy nominations for his songs, *She's All I Got*, and *Take This Job and Shove It*.



His career was stained by his outrageous behavior at times. His life after his mistakes proved to be one that showed he had learned some hard lessons and did his best to repair the damage which did earn him a home at the Grand Ole Opry and at Sony Music. He is a true honky-tonk legend, an outlaw musician, and a husband and father which few saw outside his true friends and family.

Johnny PayCheck was a side man that outshined many of his counterparts at times but could never get out of his own life lessons till it was too late in his life. He died on February 19, 2003, following a lengthy illness. His legacy will be remembered by his fans. His son John Paycheck is forging his own path in Country music while still honoring the legacy of his father.


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

# Without a Song... A Tribute to our Songwriters

oday's story could be about an artist who is a band member, or a soloist, or an amazing songwriter, or a legend in Christian Country music, Mr. Bruce Haynes. Bruce was originally with the band White River. If you were around when Christian Country was born in the '80s and '90s, when artists like Del Way, Ken Holloway, Susie (McEntire) Luchsinger, Midsouth, Dennis Agajanian, Susan Ashton, and Bruce Carroll were playing, then you will surely remember White River. You probably remember their songs What Ya Gonna Do?, Goin' Away Party, I Like My Gospel Country, and Rodeo Preacher, but did you know when Bill Traylor signed them to the Christian Country label Cheyenne Records, he asked if they could have ten songs ready to record in three weeks? Bruce wrote all ten of them. Their first two #1 songs, Vacation and No One Worships There Anymore were on that album. Their second album, "Heavenly High," saw four of Bruce's songs reach #1.


Over the years, more than 100 of Bruce's songs have been placed with artists to record. He received a Dove Award when Jeff & Sheri Easter recorded his song, *Goin' Away Party*. Jeff & Sheri have recorded fifteen or sixteen of

Bruce's songs and *Praise His Name* reached #1. They have also recorded *Morning's Coming* and *Learning to Dance in the Rain*.

What has prompted Bruce to continue writing through all these years? Divine inspiration from the Lord and the feedback people give him who have been impacted by one of his songs. Their stories touch his heart.

"People come up to me and say, 'Your song got me through another day,' or 'Your song got me through a divorce.' That blesses my heart," Bruce says. "There have been four or five people contact me and say, 'I was going to take my life when I heard your song.' That is amazing," Bruce continues. He was quick to share a very personal story about a farmer in South Dakota.

Bruce begins, "The farmer shared with me he was going to have to sell the family farm due to hardship. After his wife went to bed one night, he went out to the tractor shed to take his own life. He laid out a suicide note, and put a gun to his head. The radio was on in the shed, and the D.J. suddenly said, 'Somebody is getting ready to take your own life. Just



give me three minutes of your time.' Then, the D.J. put *Praise His Name* on. The farmer said he laid down the gun, tore up the suicide note, fell to his knees, and cried out to the Lord for help. The next morning, he went to the store and bought Jeff & Sheri's CD with the song on it. He told me he plays it every day. He came to see me in person, because he wanted to tell me the story. 'Your song saved my life!' He walked away, and then turned back to say, 'and we didn't lose the farm,'" Bruce continued. "I wrote the song in 1999. He told me the story in 2010. God gave me the song eleven years before he knew that farmer in South Dakota would need it."

Bruce became a solo artist after his tenure with White River. He continued traveling five more years. then went back to Presley's Country Jubilee in Branson. Next, he went to lead worship at his dad's church. Bruce had been running from preaching for twenty years, but became the senior pastor at the church after accepting the call. He still sings every Sunday and has the privilege of planning a song which goes with the sermon God has given him.

Bruce shares, "Praise His *Name* and a Lyndel Cooley praise and worship song he wrote called I Need You More are still his two most requested songs, though he has written songs for over one hundred artists - Christian Country, Southern Gospel, and Praise and Worship. He also cowrites songs and has written three Nashville Christian with Country's David Timms; Get Right or Get Left, I'm the Potter, and I Know a Man.

Bruce ended with one more incredible story which took place when he was singing at Presley's in Branson. He sang *Praise His Name* every night there. After the

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

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

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




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
